A Freak Form of Dypsis lutescens



IPS member Shri Dhar has sent photographs of a strange form of *Dypsis lutescens* cultivated in his garden in Calcutta. With its undivided leaves it looks completely different from the usual form of *Dypsis lutescens*, but specimens that Shri Dhar sent to John Dransfield at Royal Botanic Gardens Kew for identification displayed the scales, wax and texture typical of this species. *Dypsis* *lutescens* is very variable and some of the distinctive forms have been selected and clonally propagated, particularly in Thailand and the Philippines (see front cover of PALMS Vol. 43(2) (April 1999).
