# Fous de Palmiers The French Palm Society

A public information meeting on palm pests was held on February 4th, 2013 in Puget-sur-Argens, with the participation of Michel Ferry, researcher at INRA and Mrs. Anne Roberti, researcher at the PACA FREDON. Insects causing particular damage are the butterfly Pavsandisia archon and the Rhynchophorus ferrugineus (called the Red Palm Weevil). Originally from Uruguay and central Argentina, this butterfly species was accidentally introduced into southern Europe, where it is spreading rapidly and is devastating and destroying thousands palm of trees Mediterranean Europe.

The Red Palm Weevil was originally harmful to palms in Asia and Melanesia. It reached the Middle East and the Mediterranean basin in the mid-1980s, Spain in 1994, and southeast France in 2006. It continues to spread rapidly, posing major problems. The researchers are asking all palm growers to be on the lookout for these pests and to report their presence.

Each year the Fous General Assembly gathers members from throughout France. The General Assembly 2013 will be held on April 13 and 14 in Montpellier. For more on the program see the Fous website.

In 2013, the Fous de Palmiers will participate with a stand in many horticultural events. The next such event will be on April 27<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup> in Redon.

In the autumn of 2013, some Fous members will leave for 12 days to discover Florida, the US "Sunshine State", the state of the continental USA which has, in its southern part, a heavenly atmosphere for many species of palms. The group will stay in Miami Beach and go to discover the most beautiful public and private gardens from Palm Beach to Key West, via Fort Lauderdale, Miami and Coconut Grove. This will offer an excellent opportunity to preview many areas to be visited during the 2014 IPS Biennial in Florida. If you are interested in participating, contact Steve Swinscoe.

# News from Palmeraie-Union, La Réunion Chapter

The Palmeraie Union advises on their website news of interest about palms on Madagascar – an island only some 400 miles to the northwest of La Réunion. In October 2012, the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) completed the update of its Red List of Threatened Species. It has, on this occasion, sounded an alarm about the palm situation in Madagascar. The Big Island has a great floristic richness and incredible endemism, especially in palms the vast majority of species existing nowhere else in natural habitat. The Palm Specialist Group of the Species Survival Commission (SSC) recently focused on the situation in Madagascar and determined that 83% of the palms of Madagascar are now threatened with extinction. According to Jane Smart, Director, World Conservation Group of the IUCN Biodiversity "figures for the palms of Madagascar are truly terrifying, especially palm loss undermines because the exceptional biodiversity of the island and also its population. We cannot close our eyes to such a situation." The main causes of this situation are the critical clearing of land for agriculture and forestry.

Garden number one on the March tour will be at the home of Aaron and Sonya Bagley, 1010 San Andrade Dr., Encinitas, CA 92024. Their garden was started in 2008 and has over 100 palm different species of including Dypsis marojejyi, Dvpsis heteromorpha, Dypsis ambositrae, Dypsis robusta crossed with an unknown palm, Basselinia pancheri and many other New Caledonia palms. There are also many species of cycads, succulents and bromeliads. The house is on a 6100 square foot lot and is built on very hard sandstone with little soil. About fifty yards of soil were brought in to create mounds and raised beds. The garden is about a mile and a half from the coast and on a hill so it has a very good micro-climate and only a rare frost. As this winter has been fairly cold, there is some limited plant damage.

Garden number two on the March tour is at the home of Mark and Val Riedler, 3236 Brookside Lane, Encinitas, CA 92024. This garden was started in late 2003 and also has many palms, cycads, aloes and bromeliads. The lot is basically clay but 3 feet of sandy loam was imported when the house was built. This garden is 6 miles from the coast and saw a low temperature of at least 27°F (-3°C) in early January. This garden was last viewed by the PSSC members in July 2008.
