Far North Queensland Palm & Cycad Society News

The Far North Queensland Palm & Cycad Society (FNQPACA) met on September 3rd, 2003, featuring a talk by Niels Lunoe on his search for three allied species of *Livistona*. Niels described his visits to view groups of *Livistona australis*, *L.* sp. "Paluma Range" and *L.* sp. "Bluewater Range." He discusses the groups, making a comparison chart of their characteristic features. He further discussed the scientific disagreement as to whether these were all simply different morphologies of *L. australis* or truly different species. Seems (at least to Niels) that the jury is still out, and further studies are needed to resolve this issue.

The second 2003 issue of Wodyetia featured several nice color photographs of Dypsis acuminum as well as a series of beautiful palms in the garden of Jill Goetz (Kerriodoxa elegans, Chelyocarpus chuco, Dypsis faneva, Zombia antillarum, and an attractive Arenga species. There was an interesting article by Niels Lunoe describing the trips and palm examinations leading to his September talk (described above) on Livistona. There was also an article on Dypsis acuminum by Bill Beattie, who also took the referenced photos of this palm. Doug and Peg Falconer wrote "Looking for an umbrella and finding Licuala ramsayi" and there was an "Interview with Jill Goetz." There were also several cycad articles.

Cairns Palm & Cycad Expo 2003 was quite a success, in spite of the three-year drought still gripping the Cairns area. About 400 people attended (at A\$2 each entry fee.) Buyers bought most of the plants by early afternoon. There was a good selection of Cyrtostachys renda (from A\$35 to A\$400). Other palms available included Sommieria leucophylla, Licuala cordata, L. mattanensis "Mapu" (very mottled), Pelagodoxa henryana, Asterogyne martiana, Itaya amicorum, Mauritiella sp., and a nicely mottled Pinanga disticha.
