## The Biodiversity of Costa Rica May 3-10, 2008

Absolute Deadline: Registration must be received by March 15, 2008

Registrants must be IPS members before registering.

#### **OVERVIEW**

The 2008 IPS Biennial is being sponsored by the International Palm Society and hosted by selected local residents and IPS members living in Costa Rica. The event will be coordinated by CRT Destination Marketing and Management Services, our selected agency for the Biennial and the pre- and post- Biennial extension tours within Costa Rica, and by Inkaterra for the official post tour events in the Peruvian Amazon.

Providing environmental leadership and sensitivity unparalleled elsewhere, Costa Rica has set aside nearly a quarter of its land as protected areas and national parks. This commitment is further demonstrated by the scores of private conservancies that have spawned smartly planned ecotourism sites that support further unchecked land development, which impacts ecological habitats in a country that harbors nearly 5% of the world's biodiversity. While Costa Rica is best known as an invaluable refuge for nature, this nation of four million is also a haven of peace having declared its neutrality in 1949.

Located at the nexus of two continents, Costa Rica is part of a link that forms the isthmus of Central America. A mere six hours drive separates the Caribbean and Pacific Ocean and its borders are defined by Nicaragua to the North and Panama to the South. Four mountain chains form its interior giving rise to a multitude of climate zones from coastal tropical

forests to cloud shrouded rain forests in the high sierras. Costa Rica is one of Mother Nature's great bottlenecks where geography constricts a breathtaking amount of plant and animal life within 19,563 square miles (50,900 sq. km), comparable in size to Denmark or West Virginia. Its biodiversity includes more than 800 species of ferns, 1,000 of orchids, 2,000 kinds of trees, and 200 species of mammals just to start.

The rainy season lasts from May through November, and mainly falls on the Caribbean coast, giving the Pacific a much more arid climate. Our journeys are concentrated in elevation sites primarily in the Central Valley and Pacific coast on day trips from San José. The area sites were selected on bio-diversity, traveling distances, road conditions and hotel accommodations suitable for large attendance. Unlike New Caledonia and the Dominican Republic, Costa Rica's habitats are either restricted or planned to support the safety of the ecotourism industry. Our Biennial tour will span both National Parks with guides and private conservancies. Many of the sites will be turf-block since these environments will be very wet compared to most past Biennials.

It is advisable for regular attendees traveling from great distances to arrive by Saturday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>, in order to comfortably adjust from jet lag. It is imperative that Directors and Officers arrive by Saturday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>, to attend the Board Meeting on Sunday morning, May 3<sup>rd</sup>.

## Early Arrivals and Late Departures:

Attendees may choose to arrive earlier or depart later than the above Biennial dates. IPS room rates for the designated hotel will apply immediately before and after the Biennial and available only through our representative **CRT** Destination agent. Marketing and Management Services in San José, Costa Rica. For details see Contacts for **Information.** Charges for these extended stays are not included in the registration fee and must be paid separately by the attendee directly to CRT. The Biennial registration fee only covers those accommodations specifically described in the Biennial itinerary.

The IPS cannot book extra days of lodging or airline flights.

<u>Biennial Location:</u> The Biennial will begin and end in the capital city of San José. Attendees are advised to make airline reservations early.

The IPS cannot guarantee that the itinerary will be followed precisely.

## **Cost of Biennial:**

Since Costa Rica is a high demand destination, we are offering an early registration discount of \$150 for all who sign up prior to December 15<sup>th</sup>, 2007. This discount is reflected in the pricing below.

- ➤ Registration per person for <u>double</u> occupancy RECEIVED by December 15 is \$1.225.
- ➤ Registration per person for <u>single</u> occupancy RECEIVED by December 15 is \$1,725.
- ➤ Registration per person for <u>double</u> occupancy RECEIVED December 16 through March 15 is \$1,375.
- ➤ Registration per person for <u>single</u> occupancy RECEIVED December 16 through March 15 is \$1,875.

The Biennial registration fee includes seven nights hotel accommodations, all meals except for 2 dinners while in San José, tours, guides, and airport transfers. Breakfast is included in the cost of each night's Biennial accommodations. Not included are personal expenses (such as laundry, telephone, gratuities, bar charges, and extra meals, trip insurance, airfare and airport charges for all flights to and from Costa Rica. Also Hotel costs and meals for early arrivals (earlier than May 3<sup>rd</sup>), or for those staying the night of May 10<sup>th</sup> or later, are NOT included in the Biennial registration fee.

Biennial Registration does not include fees for any pre- or post-tour events in Costa Rica or Peru. Registrations for these tours must be made separately, to the respective agents. See the **Contacts For Information** section for more.

Partial Registration: Because of the complexity of the Biennial's itinerary and the fact that the group is traveling to multiple areas, partial attendance is unavailable and no reduced rate for partial registration is being offered. Attendees with "special schedules" (i.e., partially attending the Biennial) must pay the full registration fee and arrange their individual transportation to accommodate their specific needs. All attendees will be charged the regular fee regardless of where they plan their accommodations.

## Airfare To/From San José, Costa Rica:

Attendees are responsible for booking and paying for their own round trip flights to San José. It is suggested you book your tickets early to get the best fares. It is also suggested you book your flights before you register for the Biennial. Please note that the main airport of destination in Costa Rica is the Juan Santamaría International Airport (Airport Code SJO).

**Book now!** Be prepared for the very strict, time-consuming security inspections at all airports for all flights. Be sure to have a valid passport and avoid carry-on baggage to facilitate inspection. As the regulations on passport expiration has changed for many countries, make sure your passport does not expire within six months of the date of travel.

### Marco & Gerardo Herrero's Farms:

Two adjacent farm/nurseries (20 hectares each) were founded with stock from the Wilson Garden in Las Cruces. The Herrero collection contains over a thousand species.

### **INBioparque**

This sensory experience combining nature trails with multimedia technology is located in Santo Domingo de Heredia, only 20 minutes away from the hotel. The 20-acre park's development introduces the wide spectrum of biodiversity allowing attendees to experience samples of Costa Rica's ecosystems: tropical humid forest, tropical dry forest and Central Valley native forest. In the park's facilities you can learn about our planet's biodiversity and the search for and development of new products: medicines, cosmetics, and nutritional and agricultural Participants are also introduced to Costa Rica's conservation efforts and the creation of national parks, biological reserves and other protected areas. Guest speaker before dinner will be Dr. Gerardo Avalos, Ph.D. on the functional ecology of palms in Costa Rica. www.frommers.com/destinations/sanjosecostari ca/A29684.html for more information.

Palms seen growing in habitat will include the following palm genera: Chamaedorea, Geonoma, Iriartea, Socratea, Calyptrogyne, Asterogyne, Astrocaryum, Euterpe, Acrocomia, Bactris, Synthecanthus, Hyospathe and Raphia.

## Monday May 5:

On the Monday through Thursday, participants will be split into two groups. The venues for the two groups will be reversed on the two days. For Monday, the group schedule is as follows:

- Group 1: Arenal Hanging Bridges
- Group 2: Rain Forest Aerial Tram & Quebrada González Station in Braulio Carrillo National Park.

[On Wednesday, Group 1 will visit the Rain Forest Aerial Tram & Quebrada González and Group 2 will tour the Arenal Hanging Bridges.]

### Monday May 5 (continued)

## **Group 1: Arenal Hanging Bridges**

The Arenal Hanging Bridges are located in La Fortuna within a 250-hectare (618-acre) reserve of primary forest adjacent to the active Arenal Volcano. This conservancy has 15 bridges from 5 to 100 meters long, a third of them of suspension design along a 3 km rain forest circuit of paved trails.. The bridges are built of aluminum, galvanized steel and concrete, to ensure maximum safety. Groups will be limited to twelve (12) attendees with a naturalist guide pointing out palms and other flora and fauna from ground level, from midcanopy and from above- canopy with views of the Tropical Rain Forest. The highest bridges – located on about 25% of the trail loop – require some uphill hiking. See www. Govisitcostarica. com/listings/listingDetails.asp?coid=747.

## Group 2: Rain Forest Aerial Tram & Ouebrada González.

The Rain Forest Aerial Tram is a unique eco-tourism and research facility that takes attendees through the rainforest canopy with its hanging garden of plants and animals high in the tops of tropical trees. The canopy is home to twothirds of the rainforest's species and the Aerial Tram site, on the northern border of Braulio Carrillo National Park, possesses one of the richest canopy communities in the world. Formerly inaccessible, the tram allows close observation of the canopy's varied life forms with minimal impact to the surroundings. See www.exploringcostarica.

Braulio Carrillo National Park has two ranger stations: the Zurqui sector and the Carrillo (Quebrada González). The park is fundamental for the protection of the water resources of the Sector Norte (Sarapiqui) hydroelectric project, the supplier of water to a large portion of the Central Valley. Primary cloud forest and rainforest cover the park with its abundant flora and fauna species in multiple life zones, innumerable rivers. This site is only one of three open for the public and loops 1.5 km in the cloud forest. See www.worldheadquarters.com/cr/protected\_areas/parks/braulio carrillo/.

## Tuesday, May 6:

For Tuesday, the group schedule is as follows:

Group 1: Poás Volcano & La Paz Waterfall Group 2: Carara National Park

[On Thursday, Group 1 will visit the Carara National Park and Group 2 will visit the Poás Volcano & La Paz Waterfall.]

## Group 1 Poás Volcano & La Paz Waterfall:

Poás Volcano, the most visited park in the Costa Rican National Park system, features two craters: one active and one that has formed into a lake. The massive active crater often has sulfuric smoke rising out of the boiling muddy lake on its bottom, while the beautiful crater lagoon is surrounded by dwarf vegetation and lush cloud forest with species of birds and plants native to the volcano. A 20- minute hike between the two craters passes through high altitude volcanic vegetation which does not support palm species. For more information, go to www.infocostarica.com/places/poas.html.

La Paz Waterfall Gardens is a Natural Park and Wildlife Refuge located at an altitude of 4,300 feet to 5,000 feet that provides an ideal climate for both cloud and rain forest. The trail design, with its three kilometers of serpentine paved trails and viewing platforms, allows attendees to experience and photograph the forest and the four majestic waterfalls from a number of view points. This site starts off with several conservatories housing hummingbirds, snakes, frogs; and with a Butterfly Observatory covering 18, 000 square feet with a collection of ten species of the most colorful butterflies of Costa Rica. http://www.waterfallgardens.com/

#### **Group 2: Carara National Park**

Relatively small in size (4,700- hectares), the importance of Carara arises from its location within a transition zone between the tropical dry forest to the north and the more humid Pacific rainforest to the south. Carara has flora and fauna from both ecosystems, and the virgin forest that covers most of the park is the ideal environment for such rare wildlife as the Scarlet Macaw (*Ara Macao*), the Collared Aracari (*Pteroglossus torquatos*) and three species of monkeys. ## Wednesday, May 7:

For Wednesday, the schedule is the reverse of the Monday (May 5<sup>th</sup>) schedule, with Wednesday's schedule to be:

- Group 1: Rain Forest Aerial Tram & Quebrada González Station in Braulio Carrillo National Park.
- Group 2: Arenal Hanging Bridges [On Monday, Group 1 visited the Arenal Hanging Bridges and Group 2 toured the Rain Forest Aerial Tram & Quebrada González. Groups 1 & 2 are swapping sites on these days.]

## Thursday, May 8:

For Thursday, the schedule is the reverse of the Tuesday (May 6<sup>th</sup>) schedule, with Thursday's schedule to be:

- Group 1: Carara National Park.
- Group 2: Poás Volcano & La Paz Waterfall

[On Monday, Group 1 visited the Poás Volcano & La Paz Waterfall and Group 2 toured the Carara National Park. That is, Groups 1 & 2 will be swapping sites on these two days.]

## Friday, May 9:

This will be a free day or a day for optional events (to be booked during the week with the CRT hospitality desk at additional cost). Optional events may include a city tour, canopy traversing or white water rafting.

Attendees should return to the Melia for the farewell festivities beginning at 6:00 pm.

## Saturday, May 10:

The Biennial will conclude. Attendees will be taken to the airport to return home.
