The host and owner of the garden, Davis Dalbok, is also the owner of Living Green, an interior and exterior landscape design company in San Francisco, California. To see photos of attractive Opihikao garden, this www.livinggreen.com and click on portfolio. Davis invited HIPS to tour his garden and enjoy the afternoon on his spacious deck with its ocean view. The initial plantings of palms in this garden occurred in the 1950s, so many are well established. including a huge, Metroxylon amicarum and a large Cyrtostachys renda. Although the garden was so overgrown when Davis first visited the property in 1991 that he couldn't get the rental car down the long, curving driveway, he saw the potential beauty of the grounds. Since purchasing the property, he has added palms and many other plants to develop his "dream garden." Some of his favorite palms include Licuala grandis (he has planted over a dozen), Licuala ramsayi, Verschaffeltia splendida, Bismarckia nobilis and the beautiful, large-leafed Johannesteijsmannia altifrons. Being a true landscape "artist," Davis has added bromeliads, ti, orchids and other colorful tropical foliage. He also makes use of timber bamboos and various cycad genera including Cycas, Encephalartos and Zamia. To add further interest, stone sculptures and world cultural elements are placed throughout the garden.
