New Zealand Palm & Cycad Society

The New Zealand Palm & Cycad Society (PACSONZ) held their Annual General Meeting (AGM) in October. Michael McCorquindale is the new President and Michael Budd the Vice President, with the remainder of the Committee largely unchanged, with one new member. A number of plants were for sale including some uncommon *Cycas* species. There was also a short discussion on *Cycas* species from

Vietnam. A DVD was shown on palm exploration in Madagascar where many palms are still undescribed – primarily *Dypsis* and *Ravenea* species. Some of these are small understory palms with simple leaves while others are massive with huge leaves.

The November meeting featured a presentation by Charley King from the Far North on some of his trips over the past twelve years. In addition to the plants he encountered, Charley spoke of traveling conditions and the cultures of the different people he encountered. His travelogue started with Madagascar and then moved on to Hanoi in Vietnam, thence to south India where he had some involvement with local conservation efforts.

The December 7th NZPACS meeting was the Society's annual Rare Plant Auction - held this year at Margaret and Robert Flanagan's in Drury. The day's events started off at midday. with walks around the gardens and a BBO with drinks. The tour of the garden was very interesting with many new plantings. The main event was the auction, with some fifty people there to buy and sell. The range of plants was large with many very rare species of palms and cycads. Prices were definitely in favor of the buyer and some real bargains changed hands. Even Rhopalostylis was well-represented with small and large Chatham varieties and the Little Barrier form plus a genuine Norfolk Island Nikau as well as R. cheesemanii.

There will be a "Botanical Walkabout" at the Auckland Botanic Gardens, Manurewa, on February 1, 2009, beginning at 2 pm. There will be knowledgeable members present to answer questions and provide supplemental information.

The AVEPALMAS excursion on November 16th to the "Palmetum de la Selva Nublada" of Raoul Held in Las Mercedes, Tiara, was enjoyed by six people in two four-wheel drive vehicles. The last stretch of road was not passable by normal vehicles, because of the rains. Participants were graced by a panoramic view very close to the Fila Maestra de la Serranía del Aragua and Guarico. Interior. between Introduced palms that have adapted well to this climate and altitude include: Arenga wightii, Balaka seemannii, Brahea edulis, Ravenea Rhopalostylis baueri. Sabal rivularis. "Riverside" and other plants such as Pandanus utilis and the giant bamboo Dendrocalamus giganteus which forms an impressive colony with trunks some 15 centimeters (6 inches) in diameter.

On the November 30th excursions, one group explored the "zona de niquel de Tiara" adjacent to the "finca" of von Fedak, while the other group explored the Soledad Norte mountain which has an interesting botanical assemblage of plants.

The last meeting of the year was held at La Salle 5th floor on Tuesday, December 9th. The meeting featured Dr Fred Stauffer on the Premio La Palma Dorada 2008. In addition there was a Celebration of the Declaration of the Rights of Plants, a palm raffle, and a presentation of a DVD about palms, orchids and other plants. AVEPALMAS also released CD ROMs 9, 10 and 11 of condensed AVEPALMAS.
