Fernando Roco, an expert on the palms of Peru and an IPS director gave a presentation about "Palms of Peru" on January 16th to HIPS members and guests. Pacho's presentation took viewers from the high Andes country (where some Bactris species have adapted to the cold nights) to tropical Iquitos. He showed photographs of Parajubaea cocoides from a village in a northern Peruvian rain forest. Pacho thinks that this may be the natural habitat for these palms, since the plants predate the village at this location, with about thirty plants of the species located in the nearby forest. Pacho completed his Ph.D. in ethnobiology in Paris in 2004 and currently lives in his native Lima, teaching at the university and overseeing botanical projects in developing tourist ecoresorts.
